Single Possessive Pronouns

(mio, mia, de el, de ella, de nosotros, tuyo, de ellos/ellas)

Week 22 and 23:

Plural Possessive Pronouns

(mine, his, hers, ours, yours, theirs)

(mios, mias, de el, de ella, de nosotros, tuyos, de ellos/ellas)

Week 24:

Introduction to verbs (infinitive-examples: cantar, correr, escribir/ sing, run, write)

Week 25:

Subject-Verb Agreement (The cat runs. The cats run.) (El gato corre. Los gatos corren.)

Linking Verbs-Present Tense Conjugation

Estar / To be (am)

Poder / To be able to (can)

Tener / To have (have)

Week 28 and 29:

Linking Verbs-Past Tense Conjugation
