Character Chat Room

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*This assignment was inspired by this fabulous article <u>7 Tips For Using Social Media In Your Classroom</u> from NBC News Education Nation

Project Description - Using the chat room site <u>Todaysmeet.com</u>, students will assume the role of key character in our class novel.

The key to this project is organization. Here are some suggestions:

- Assign each student a character and have them become an expert about that character, re-reading key passages that involve the character.
- Before the day of the chat, put your students in groups and create a chat room for each group.
- Go into the room yourself and write a post that says "This is period 7, chat room 5" or the like so they know they're in the right place. It will help you later, too.
- Students need scaffolding when they chat. Projecting a powerpoint or other document
 with prompts is a good way to keep the chat lively and focused on the big ideas of the
 book. I put the questions below in a powerpoint, then rang a bell each time I changed
 the slides. Here's the presentation.
