Reading Project

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Project Description- After my 8th graders finished reading their independent reading book, they created a project for the novel they read.

The goals of the project were for students to identify and analyze the elements of the book. The project asked students to describe the most important setting in the novel, compare and contrast the protagonist and antagonist, identify and describe the conflict, provide a summary of five major events, state the theme along with textual evidence, identify a symbol, write an opinion and to put themselves in the shoes of the protagonist.

In previous years, this project was done as a poster.

This project is to be done for the last book you've finished. The purpose of this project is show that you have understood the basic elements of fiction. The following things need to be present in your project. You made add other elements to your project, but every project should have at least the following information. Your project can be done as a poster or as a power point presentation.
